COME NOW the Commission on Judicial Conduct through its attorney, Curtis M. Janhunen, and the Honorable Kenneth R. Eiesland (Respondent), himself and his attorney, Steven W. Thayer, and hereby enter the following Stipulation and agree as follows:

## STIPULATED FACTS

- 1. The Honorable Kenneth R. Eiesland was at all times discussed herein a Judge of the Clark County District Court.
- 2. From at least as early as February 1, 1990, and continuing through at least March 31, 1992, the Respondent used the telephone in his court chambers to make numerous long distance phone calls to Portland on what he considered to be a toll-free line for personal matters not related to the business of the court. In addition, he made at least one long distance

call to a location other than Portland on a personal matter not related to the business of the court. Clark County paid for the calls. Thereafter, Respondent reimbursed Clark County for the calls.

- 3. The Respondent asked court personnel to prepare his personal correspondence using Clark County equipment and supplies on three to five occasions over the eight years he has served as a District Court Judge. Court personnel complied at his request on each occasion.
- 4. Examples of the improper use of court equipment and staff include the preparation at public expense of private correspondence and minutes of homeowners association meetings. The Commission on Judicial Conduct sent Respondent a Statement of Allegations concerning this conduct on February 10, 1993. Thereafter, Respondent reimbursed Clark County for the use of the staff and equipment.
- 5. The Respondent has received no prior discipline for any violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct by the Commission.
- 6. The Respondent cooperated with the Commission by promptly filing his Response to the Statement of Allegations.
- 7. The Respondent's explanation indicated that the number of telephone calls were few and that he thought the calls he made to Portland, Oregon, were toll free.
- 8. The Commission and Respondent stipulate that the Respondent's conduct was a violation of Canons 1, 2(A), and 3(B) of the Code of Judicial Conduct.
