EXPLANATION OF MY CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

Before questioning and the making of any statement, I, THORNTON B HATER, have been advised

by C/Sgt. Wm. DiMonda of the following rights:

- T.H. (1) I have the right to remain silent.
- T.H. (2) Anything that I say or sign can be used against me in a court of law. (I understand that if I am a juvenile, anything that I say or sign can be used against me in a criminal prosecution in the event that Juvenile Court declines jurisdiction in my case.
- T.H. (3) I have the right at this time to an attorney of my own choosing, and to have him present before and during questioning and the making or signing of any statement.
- T.H. (4) If I cannot afford an attorney, I am entitled to have one appointed for me by a court without cost to me and to have him present before and during questioning and the making or signing of any statement.
- T.H. (5) I further understand that I have the right to exercise any of the above rights at any time before or during any questioning and the making or signing of any statement.

WAIVER OF CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

I have read the above explanation of my constitutional rights and I understand them. I have decided not to exercise these rights at this time. The following statement is made by me freely and voluntarily and without threats or promises of any kind.

T.H. I met Tim Bear about a month ago. I had picked him up while he was hitchhiking near Aurora Village Mall. I had just purchased my car and was out driving around. When I told Bear that then he asked if he could ride around with me for a while. I agreed. We drove mainly around Snohomish County, through Lynden, Everett and back over several hours. I got tired of driving and we went to my house in Lake Forest Park. We stayed up the remainder of the morning talking. I made breakfast for myself and Bear. I began to question him about things he had mentioned that morning. He said he lived, or had lived in Everett, Terrace until about one month prior, when he had left home. He said his father beat him and his mother often

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and that the father had a drinking problem. I asked him where he lived now and he said in the streets. It was obvious that either he didn't or hadn't had much access to toilet facilities because he smelled bad. I confronted him about his hygiene, and how he was taking care of himself and what his plans were. He said his friends gave him money and that he was staying with another street person named "Steve" who was about 120 yrs old. Tim told me he was the one and that Steve was trying to get him a job. I asked why he wasn't staying with Steve that night and he said only that Steve was away for the weekend and that he wanted to hang out. I asked him what he was doing before I had picked him up, and he said another guy had picked him up and he had agreed to go to that person's house in the University Dist; that that guy had molested him while they were in the car, but that he (Bear) had decided not to go into the house with the man, though the man had offered him money for further sex.

I talked to Bear at length about "not getting anything for nothing" and told him that in getting involved in prostitution, that there may be more strings attached than he had thought about. I "lectured" him about both disease and specifically told him never to let anyone do anything sexual with him for that reason. We talked about the "Green River" piller, because Bear said he got a weird feeling about the Univ Dist man. I talked to him about losing a very important part of his life and learning experience if he began to equate "love" or "sex" with money, before he'd had much experience. Bear admitted that he had gone out that evening, looking to make money by selling his body, but that he had not done so. He did a little and thanked me for talking frankly with him. He asked if "we could be friends," and I said I'd be willing to stay in touch. He wanted me to give him money, which I did not do. I offered to

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gave him and told him he would take a shower. We talked about taking care of the "basics" - food and shelter and I stated that these should be his priorities.

When confronted, he said yes he was looking for someone to take care of him. I told him that I would not be the one. Bear called a couple of days later and wanted to take a shower. He had it the first time when he came over he said he and "Steve" were staying in a meat trailer/mobile home on Hwy 99. After he took a shower he washed his clothes. My roommate Jeff Slater was present both occasions and Bear showered himself, nor was there any physical contact between us.

I agreed to look for him when I was at Aurora Village, because he said he was there most days. I gave him one of my business cards so that he could call at home or work, if he wanted to. He called a couple of nights ago saying he was with a friend and wanted to come over because he had no place to go. This was about 11:30 p.m. this past Thursday. I declined but said I'd check on him again soon.

I saw him briefly the evening of 5-28-85 at Aurora Village about 7 p.m. I had a neighborhood meeting that started immediately but agreed to meet him at 9:30 p.m.

I was a sucker for the "I haven't eaten in 7 days" routine. I met Bear at @ 9:30 on 5-28-85. He said he had never eaten a fruit pie he had stolen from a store. I told him "if he remembered our prior conversation, and told him that

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he didn't have to do that, because it wasn't worth going to jail over a 50¢ pipe. I took him to eat at a restaurant in So. Inverett ("Mamma's"). We drove south from the restaurant a little after 10:30 p.m.

Bear likes to drive around but I couldn't stay out too late because of work. We did drive through Edmonds Waterford, where I stopped for cigarettes, from there south through Woodway where Bear pointed out school he attended. We drove just inside King City to Delmonde Beach to look at the oil tanks. The road was a dead end. I turned around and stopped to relieve myself in the bushes. It got back inside the car intending to drop Bear back at Avenue Village.

Bear said he had driven a car today (steal) and also said his stomach felt fine now that I had fed him, but that he had a backache from pushing the friends car he drove. He asked if I would give him a back rub and I agreed. He said, "I guess I should take my shirt off." I began giving him short & quick chops and cups on his shoulder. The police came.

I did not remove any clothing from Bear. The officer (McMorda) said Bear had his pants down and had an erection. I am not sure that his pants were down and would have been it seems if that were true. When the other officer went to the passenger door it said that Bear had his pants on. I did not see, or touch, Bear sexually or in any sexual regard of his. Bear laid in the seat on his stomach. When I removed his back, off McMorda said Bear said I "disturbed" it.

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him. That is a lie. ^{T.H.} DeMorda also said Beas said I had given him drug tablets (1/25-5/29) as well as on a prior occasion. That is also a lie. On the latter basis, it agreed to allow Off. DeMorda to search my car, whereas I had refused earlier.

I don't know why Beas would ~~accuse~~ ^{accuse T.H.} me of violating him, unless it's because I had signed thus far to give him any money. T.H.
